

When it started in 1848-49, the settlement of Sutter Creek was a small camp offering food, drink, and mining equipment. By 1854, it was an actual town, which was legally founded on September 4th of that year. Business signs marked the village's chief emporiums: Union Hotel, American





## SUTTER CREEK MAIN STREET Historic Buildings


